Permanent Committee for Geospatial Data Infrastructure of the Americas (PC-IDEA)

Established on February 29, 2000, based on the Resolution #3 of the 6th United Nations Regional Cartographic Conference for the Americas – UNRCC-A (1997)



- To maximize the economic, social and environmental benefits derived from the use of Geospatial Information
- Accomplished through knowledge and exchange of experiences and technologies between countries, based on common standards which would allow the establishment of the <u>Geospatial</u> <u>Data Infrastructure of the Americas</u>
- It implements the regional mechanism associated to the United Nations Global Geospatial Information Management (UN-GGIM) initiative



PC-IDEA Objectives



- Establish and coordinate <u>policies and technical standards</u> for the development of geospatial data infrastructure for the Americas
- Promote the <u>establishment and development of NSDI</u> in each PC-IDEA member country
- Promote the <u>interoperability of information and systems</u> among member countries, through the use of <u>standards</u>
- Encourage the <u>sharing of geospatial information</u> among all member countries in the Americas, while respecting their autonomy and their national laws and policies
- Stimulate <u>cooperation</u>, <u>research</u>, <u>complementation</u> and <u>sharing of experience</u> in areas of knowledge related to geospatial data
- Advise in the drafting of guidelines and strategies to support PC-IDEA member countries in <u>developing geospatial information</u>, considering the individual needs of each country
- Set <u>priorities for information sharing</u>, considering the regulatory framework of each member country
- Promote SDI training activities and technology transfer









PC-IDEA implements the resolutions of the United Nations Regional Cartographic Conferences for the Americas (UNRCC-A), held every 4 years

 - b) Technical standards and specifications
 - c) Best practices and applications
 - d) Innovations for national mapping agency business models



- ✓ Establishment of mechanisms for the construction of SDI in the region
- ✓ Survey on the state of mapping by countries
- ✓ Creation of a forum to exchange and share SDI best practices
- Organization of an event to discuss disaster and risk management and SDI
- ✓ Support of the construction of SDI in developing countries, especially in the Caribbean region

PC-IDEA Working Group on Planning (GTplan)

- Established during the 5th Executive Board meeting held in May 2010 in New York
- Composed by 7 countries representatives: Brazil, Canada, Chile, Colombia, Cuba, Guatemala and Mexico, under the leadership of Chile and the co-leadership of Canada
- Working on the implementation plan of 7 resolutions issued by the 9th UNRCC-A, held in August 2009 in New York
- 4 meetings held so far:
 - December 2010, in Rio de Janeiro
 - May 2011, in New York
 - August 2011, in Rio de Janeiro
 - February 2012, in Rio de Janeiro








July 2011: ECOSOC established the UNCE-GGIM as the official UN consultative mechanism on GGIM


Nations of the world are invited to reflect on the need of establishing/updating institutional arrangements and geospatial policies to spread the proper use of geospatial technologies, data and services


Pro-tempore Working Group






Final Remarks
