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CARIGEO

- Collaborative effort between the United Nations Regional Committee on Global Geospatial Information Management for the Americas (UN-GGIM: Americas), the United Nations Economic Commission for Latin America and the Caribbean (UN-ECLAC), public agencies of the Member States and Territories within the Caribbean, organizations of the geospatial private sector, academic institutions and representatives of civil society,
- Seeks to empower the countries and territories of the Caribbean region to advance in the use and exchange of geospatial information, statistics and related information supporting better decision-making for sustainable national and regional development.

The Caribbean Geospatial Development Initiative is intended to improve Geospatial Data Infrastructures at the national and regional levels in the Caribbean, building on recent and on-going developments, leveraging indigenous skills and resources, and utilising external resources and technical expertise.
