














Restrictions of prohibition on the entry of foreign travelers	January 31st	OPM	Ban imposed on travel to and from China, all travelers entering from Chine are subject to immediate 14-day quarantine, those exhibiting symptoms of COVID 19 are subject to immediate isolation.
	March 25th		From the 25th March 2020, to the 7th April 2020, no person shall be permitted to enter Jamaica, excepting those authorized by Ministry of Immigration and approved by Cabinet.
Border closures and controls	January 31st	OPM	Ban imposed on travel to and from China, all travelers entering from Chine are subject to immediate 14-day quarantine, those exhibiting symptoms of COVID 19 are subject to immediate Isolation.
	February 27th		Travel restrictions expanded to include Italy, South Korea/Republic of Korea, Singapore and Iran –persons who have visited the above within 14 days will not be granted entry, excepting Jamaicans and permanent residents who will be subject to health assessment and quarantine
	March 10th		Covid Cruise ship Protocol; Updated Maritime Declaration of Health required within 4 hours of ship arrival
	March 14th		UK added to list of travel restricted countries. Jamaicans and permanent residents who have travelled to the UK in March subject to health assessment and quarantine.
	March 15th		All travelers from local transmission countries and any Jamaicans who have had contact with these persons are required to self-guarantine for up to 14 days.
	March 21st		Closure of all air and seaports to incoming passengers for a period of 14 days. Exiting passengers permitted to leave based on travel availability.

Restriction or closure of public places and mass gatherings	March 12th		Suspension of public gathering permits over 14 days and revocation of those issued for that time period
	March 18th		Public gathers restricted to 20 persons
			Public transport service is limited to seated passengers only and taxis are required to transport one less passenger.
	March 25th		Public gatherings limited to 10 persons, and each person shall maintain a distance of at least 91.44 cm from other persons.
Other: Commencement of island-wide curfew	March 31st		Commencement of nightly islandwide curfews for a period of seven (7) days with effect from 8:00pm on April 1, 2020 to 6:00am on April 8, 2020. This includes restrictions on all movement of persons except for those in the medical services (doctors, nurses), persons in the Business Processing Outsourcing Industry and other personnel who fall under the essential services, beyond the hours stipulated. Exempted persons will be required to produce valid identification. There will also be restrictions on public transportation.


