 Since 2002 we have responded to around 80 emergencies (plus many more remotely).



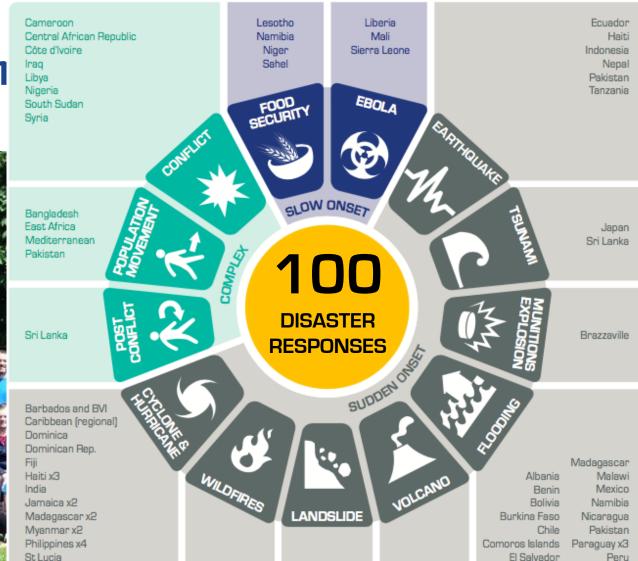

What do we mean by communities?

- Wider humanitarian community helping those who respond :
 - To Covid-19
 - To all other responses while dealing with Covid-19
- Communities have layers and subgroups
 - Most vulnerable need to be included
 - Still don't have access to all the tech
 - Have to sift out rumour and fake news from real information and offers of assistance
- Need to link the "Global Community" to local communities



Organisations linking to those communities

- Civil Society (NGO, FBO, CBO,)
 - Do much of the communication, advocacy and aid relief
 - Need connecting in to the wider humanitarian effort
 - Can utilise tech
 - Assessment tools
 - Simple geospatial tools and self help mechanisms
 - Connect them into the technical "community"
 - Crowdmappers (Missing Maps, HOT, ...)







- Continue development work
 - CDEMA GeoCRIS
- Match Covid to use of data and visualisations for other regional needs
- Hurricane season round the corner....





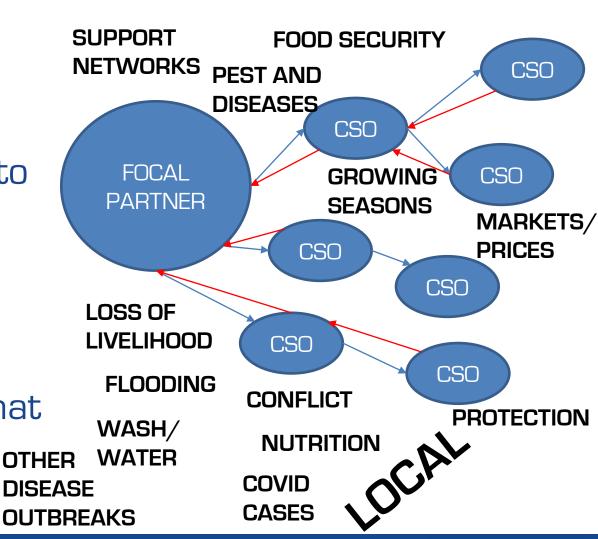
- Syria
 - Working with the Camp Coordination and Camp Management Cluster نينوي
 - Identifying where are displaced people living
 - Help characterise their vulnerabilities
 - Use geospatial tools to manage Covid NATIONAL measures
 - Isolation areas, distribution methods, decongesting areas

Where else should we look?

- Global monitoring saturated?
- More need to dig deeper
 - Specific Community foci (where are the most vulnerable)
 - Camps, displaced in the community
 - Urban/Peri urban Access to Food, Water, WASH, Livelihood, Security
 - Remote Locations (highland, island, nomads)
 - CSO Networks eyes and ears on the ground



Challenges for Technologist and Humanitarians

- Keep flexible
 - more than ever the humanitarian landscape is highly dynamic
 - Need to refine tools, update and innovate over next few months
- One size does not fit all
 - Customize to different communities and situations
- The rest of the world is not stopping
 - Vanuatu, Caribbean Hurricane Season, Locusts, Drought and flood seasons, Conflict
- Think about our modalities of work



Challenges for Technologist and Humanitarians

- Keep talking
 - Make the right partnerships
 - Link technologists, humanitarians, communities
 - Spillover and Scaleup appropriate solutions
 - Use established networks
 - Communicate regularly
 - Try not to duplicate
 - Identify the gaps
- Remember those already most vulnerable are more vulnerable because of Covid-19
