Role of ECOSOC

- One of 6 principal organs of the United Nations
- Membership 54 Member States
- ECOSOC responsible for:
 - advances the sustainable development agenda
 - Foster debate and innovative thinking
 - Forges consensus on the way forward and coordinates to achieve internationally agreed goals
- Committee of Experts on UN-GGIM one of 5 expert bodies comprised of government experts
 - that reports to ECOSOC

Global Context - UN-GGIM

Formal inter-governmental UN Committee of Experts to:

- Enhance and coordinate Global Geospatial Information Management activities
- Make joint decisions and set directions on the use of geospatial information
- Work with Governments to improve policy, institutional arrangements, and legal frameworks
- Address global issues and contribute collective knowledge
- Develop effective strategies to build geospatial capacity in developing countries

Why a PR report and Resolution

At its 47th plenary in July 2011, ECOSOC, established the Committee of Experts on Global Geospatial Information Management (UN-GGIM), and:

 Requested the Committee to present to ECOSOC in 2016 a comprehensive review of all aspects of its work and operations, in order to allow Member States to assess its effectiveness.

Resolution

2011/24

Committee of Experts on Global Geospatial Information Management

The Economic and Social Council,

1. *Takes note* of the report of the Secretary-General on global geospatial information management³ and the recommendations contained therein;

2. *Recognizes* the need to promote international cooperation in the field of global geospatial information;

3. Decides, in this regard, to establish the Committee of Experts on Global Geospatial Information Management, in accordance with the terms of reference contained in the annex to the present resolution, to be established and administered within existing resources and organized accordingly, and requests the Committee to present to the Economic and Social Council in 2016 a comprehensive review of all aspects of its work and operations, in order to allow Member States to assess its effectiveness;

4. *Encourages* Member States to hold regular high-level, multi-stakeholder discussions on global geospatial information, including through the convening of global forums, with a view to promoting a comprehensive dialogue with all relevant actors and bodies;

5. *Emphasizes* the importance of promoting national, regional and global efforts to foster the exchange of knowledge and expertise, to assist developing countries in building and strengthening national capacities in this field.





Steps – Prepare & Approval PR report




Steps – Preparation and Endorsement of ECOSOC Resolution

ECOSOC Resolution 2016/27

Strengthening institutional arrangements on GIM

- Adopted 27 July 2016
- Facilitated and submitted by Permanent Mission of Mexico
- Introduced by Co-Chair R. Ocampo
- Co-sponsored by 12 Member States
- 24 clauses
 - 9 preamble paragraphs and
 - 15 operational paragraphs



Implications of Resolution

Regional Infrastructure

- Substantive work of Regional Cartographic
 Conferences for the Americas and Asia and the Pacific assumed by UN-GGIM respective regional bodies.
- Greater autonomy over regional activities and responsibility to convene annual meetings outside UN formal arrangements

• Funding

- Member States encouraged to provide voluntary contributions
- Secretariat solicit contributions secondments, trust
 fund



United Nations Committee of Experts on Global Geospatial Information Management

Influence and Transform National Policy Agendas

- Impetus to increase the level of geospatial understanding and rate of uptake at the policy level.
- Move GI up the value chain.
- Engage at a much higher level, more strategically, change the language and messages.
- Transformative change is needed business as usual is no longer an option.
- We need to be global geo-information champions
